### [Scientific databases](#)

Tallinn University Academic Library (TLU AL) offers access to more than 50 licensed databases. Members of the TLU can also access the databases from outside the university and library network. To access them remotely, you must log in with your TLU account ID. Please also see the [E-Databases User Guide](#).

The Discovery search portal brings together almost all the databases we have access to and allows you to search scientific literature in several databases at once.

### E-catalogue [ESTER](#)

For information on the materials held in the collections of the TLU AL ([www.tlulib.ee](http://www.tlulib.ee)), please consult the e-catalogue ESTER. The catalogue provides a reference list of books, journals, films, etc., the number of copies and information on ordering and borrowing items. The catalogue also contains records of several e-resources, including both free and restricted access material (ESTER does not include the collections of licensed databases ordered by the TLU AL).

If you would like to see search results only for items in our collection, please select the appropriate option from the drop-down menu before starting your search. The location of open shelves is shown in the open collections guide, which opens when you click on the blue icon next to the location of the item.

[ETERA](#) is the digital library of the TLU Academic Library, where you can find theses and dissertations defended at TLU, study materials, various books, magazines, newspapers, postcards, photos, maps, posters, etc. Materials digitised in the Library's Digitisation Centre will be made available in the ETERA environment.

[DIGAR](#) is the National Library's user environment that provides access to publications stored in the digital archive. DIGAR contains both free and restricted access resources. Tab-marked items can only be accessed on the premises of the library, at authorised workstations. The authorised workstation of the Academic Library is in the reading room on the third floor of the Research Library.
